Canada Gas 2026 convenes at a pivotal moment in the country's energy evolution, as global demand for natural gas surges and Canada seizes its opportunity to become a leading force in clean energy exports. With projects like LNG Canada now operational and Indigenous-led terminals such as Cedar LNG and Ksi Lisims LNG preparing to launch, Canada is rewriting the energy narrative—not just in terms of output, but in ownership, equity, and sustainability. The Carney government has amplified this momentum with sweeping reforms aimed at fast-tracking strategic infrastructure, unlocking billions in trade corridor investments, and removing bureaucratic bottlenecks through policies like “One Project, One Review.”

In parallel, the expansion of the Indigenous Loan Guarantee Program to \$10 billion is enabling First Nations to take the reins of energy development, turning stakeholders into decision-makers.

Canada's export ambitions extend far beyond its southern neighbor: LNG shipments are scaling toward Asia and Europe, bolstered by a \$5 billion diversification fund and critical port and pipeline upgrades. As global LNG supply rises by 40 billion cubic metres in 2026, and demand grows 2%—driven primarily by Asia—Canada is uniquely poised to meet this appetite with low-emission, responsibly produced natural gas.

The conference showcases how Canada can lead through innovation, reconciliation, and collaboration, weaving Indigenous stewardship and government strategy into a vision for energy prosperity that's both globally competitive and locally empowering. In a world hungry for stable, clean energy, Canada can lead.

CANADIAN LNG EXPORT PROJECTS & PROPOSALS INCLUDE:

PROJECT: LNG CANADA PHASE 1

Canada's first large-scale LNG export terminal in Kitimat, B.C., comprises two liquefaction trains with a combined capacity of 14 Mtpa and loaded its inaugural cargo in July 2025

Location: Kitimat, BC
Target Start: 2025

PROJECT: LNG CANADA PHASE 2

Pending a final investment decision, this expansion at Kitimat would add two more trains to double capacity to 28 Mtpa, with start-up targeted between 2027 and 2030

Location: Kitimat, BC
Target Start: 2027–2030

PROJECT: WOODFIBRE LNG

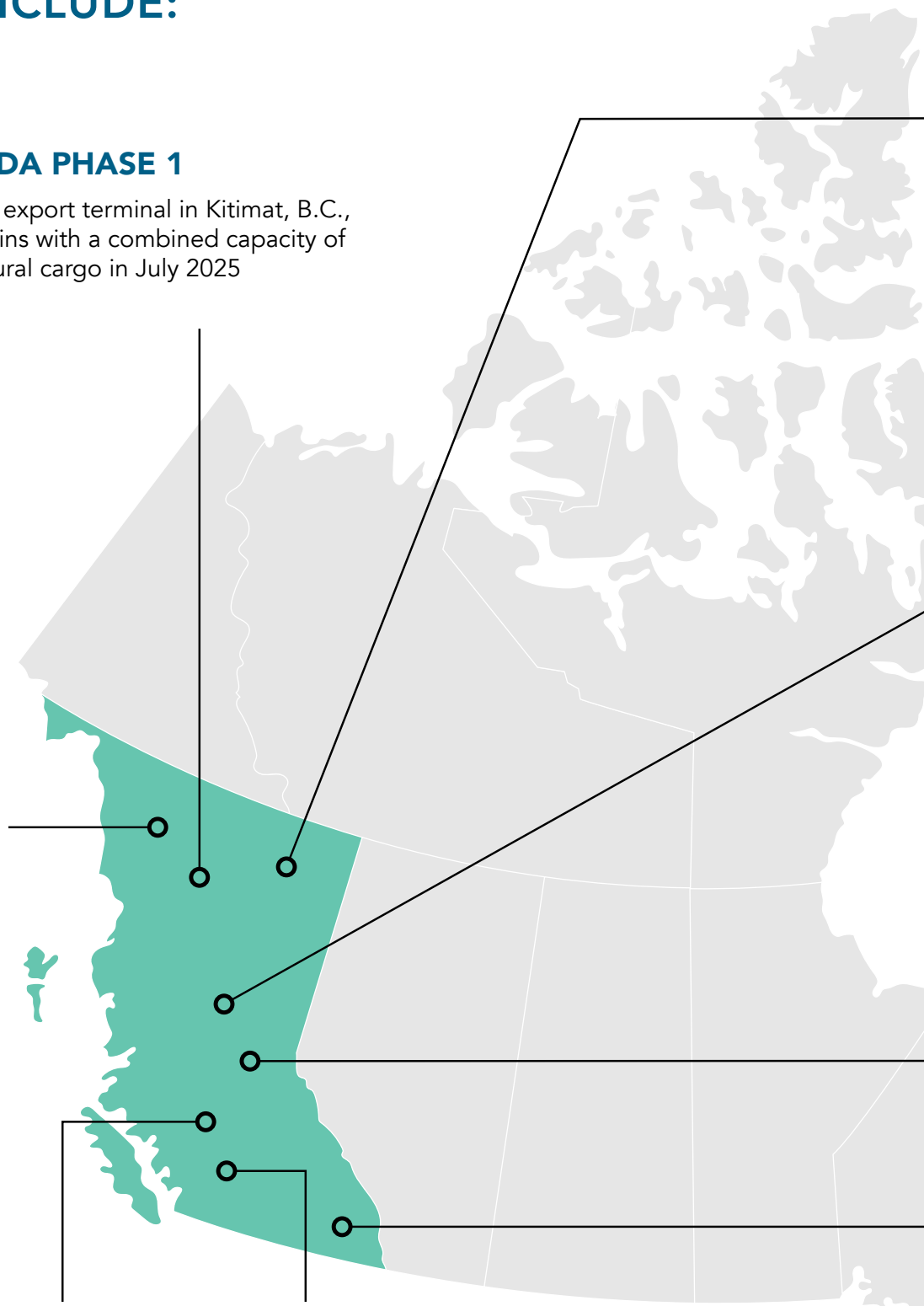
A 2.1 Mtpa facility at the former pulp-mill site near Squamish, B.C., regulated under a unique Squamish Nation environmental agreement and slated to begin exports in 2027

Location: Squamish, BC
Target Start: 2027

PROJECT: KSI LISIMS LNG

A floating 12 Mtpa LNG project on Nisga'a Nation land near Gingolx, B.C., developed in partnership with Rockies LNG and Western LNG, aiming for first production around 2028

Location: Gingolx, BC
Target Start: 2029





PROJECT: CEDAR LNG

A 3 Mtpa floating terminal in Kitimat majority-owned by the Haisla Nation and Pembina, projected to start operations in late 2028

Location: Kitimat, BC
Target Start: Late 2028

PROJECT: TILBURY LNG PHASE 2

An expansion of FortisBC's Delta site adding 2.5 Mtpa of additional storage and liquefaction capacity to support peak-shaving and export services

Location: Delta, BC
Target Start: 2028

PROJECT: SUMMIT LAKE PG LNG

A 2.7 Mtpa rail-to-ship LNG plant proposed 30 km north of Prince George at the Hart Industrial Site, designed to liquefy pipeline gas into ISO containers for export, with commercial service aimed for 2028

Location: Prince George, BC
Target Start: n/a

PROJECT: INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT

A dedicated LNG bunkering and export berth on Tilbury Island, Delta, servicing carriers and bunkers from the adjacent FortisBC plant and granted its provincial environmental certificate in March 2024

Location: Tilbury Marine Jetty
Target Start: n/a
